Dear Friends of the International Shrine of St. Jude,

St. Jude is known for being the Saint for Desperate Cases. If there is any time in our history when many feel hopeless or depressed it is during these months since the pandemic hit our world.

The International Shrine of St. Jude was built in 1826. At that time it was called the Mortuary Chapel. The City was plagued by the Yellow Fever. Thousands of people died during this time. It almost wiped out the City's population. We survived this epidemic once they discovered it was caused by the mosquitos coming from the cargo ships from the West Indies.

In 1918, after the War, many soldiers returned home and they brought the Spanish Influenza. Once again, our country lost many thousands of people due to this disease. We survived!

Our own City of New Orleans went through many hurricanes and most especially Katrina. At that time 80% of our City was devastated. Once again, we survived!

Today, then, we mustn't lose hope. St. Jude, is known for being the Saint for the Hopeless. Let us turn to our faith and trust in Jesus. He is the Strength that we all need during these days. No matter what disasters or crises we go through, Jesus is there to give us the strength. He promised it! In Psalm 23 we hear: "even if you walk in a dark valley, fear no evil, I am with you to give you courage and strength". Let us turn each day to the Lord, Our Shepherd, and ask Him for the strength we need. May this coming Novena to St. Jude lift us up and give us the Hope and Courage we need during these days. \$3 parking is available at the **Premier Parking** Lot across from the Rectory. Push the **MORE** button and you may need to push it twice until you see

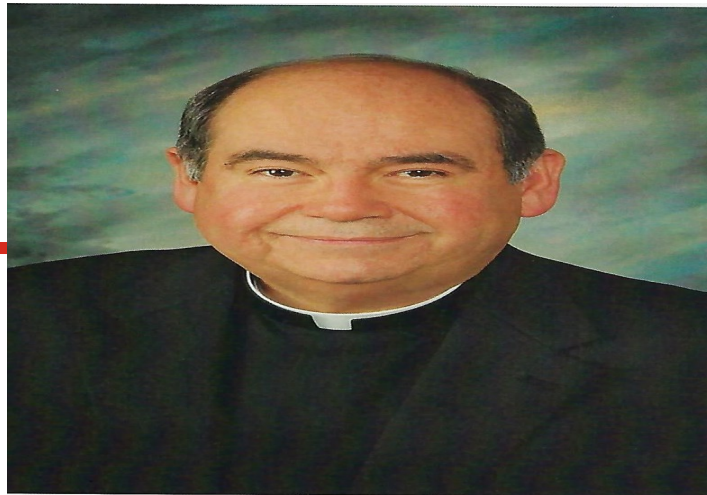
